About AVERT

The AVERT (Addressing Violent Extremism and Radicalisation to Terrorism) Research Network is a multidisciplinary, multi-institutional research network based in Melbourne, Australia and is supported by Deakin University's Alfred Deakin Institute for Citizenship and Globalisation (ADI). AVERT Research Network members conduct research into a wide array of topics related to terrorism, political violence, radicalisation and violent extremism, and their prevention.

Our Network is composed of highly engaged and informed researchers from a variety of universities and institutions. The Network and its members collaborate with a diverse range of academic, community, government and civil society stakeholders.

The AVERT Research Network was established in 2018 and has a growing membership base of more than 70 Research Members from around the world. The Network also has many Affiliate Members who are practitioners, policy makers and early career researchers.

The Network is led by the AVERT Convener, supported by the AVERT Coordinator and its operations are governed by an Executive Committee and Steering Committee made up of its members. More information on the current Convener, Coordinator and Committee members can be found on our website.

We receive institutional support from ADI and receive annual funding from the Australian Department of Home Affairs to support specific program activities. The Network also seeks and receives funding for other specific research and engagement activities.

AVERT believes in conducting meaningful evidence-based research for the public good.

We research a wide array of topics related to terrorism and other forms of political violence, radicalisation, extremism and violent extremism.

We focus on some of the big challenges around violent extremism and terrorism, including:

What are the drivers and contributors to terrorism and violent extremism on individual and societal levels?

How are the dynamics and risks of terrorism and violent extremism changing and evolving?

What prevention strategies are most effective?

How can we divert and disengage those already on pathways to extremist violence?

We engage with a diverse range of academics, community members, civil society organisations and government agencies. We partner with these sectors to deliver:

- qualitative and quantitative analysis and insights;
- participatory and collaborative research design and methods;
- social policy research;
- · methodology assessment and review;
- ethically collected, analysed and managed research data;
- multi-method and multi-discipline approaches;
- rigorous commitment to peer review, dialogue and debate.

We are committed to fostering productive dialogue by bringing together a range of perspectives and voices on relevant issues.
